## STANDING RULES (UPDATE FOR 2021)

### Standing Rules of El Camino Real District United Methodist Women CA-NV Conference

Changed text to be voted on at 2020 Annual Celebration is in underlined red type.

The Constitution and By-Laws of El Camino Real District are those published by the Women's Division of the Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church. These Standing Rules are a supplement to the aforementioned Constitution and By-Laws and have been adopted to facilitate the work of the El Camino Real District UMW.

#### I. Voting Body

The voting members at the Annual Meeting of **El Camino Real District** United Methodist Women shall include all members in local units and district members of the **El Camino Real District**.

#### II. Nominations and Elections

A. District Leadership Team members of the UMW shall be elected at the Annual Meeting for a two-year term and shall assume their duties on January 1 following the election. Outgoing District Leadership Team members shall be responsible for performing duties through December 31<sup>st</sup>.

B. The Chairperson of Nominations is elected for a two-year term and can serve for up to two terms. She serves as a member of the Executive Committee.

Nominations Committee members are elected for a four-year term. The Committee on Nominations shall consist of 4 – 8 members. The committee shall be representative of the membership of the district in matters of employment, age, and racial and ethnic background. Consideration shall be given to geographic representation of the district. The committee shall be divided into classes with no member serving more than one four-year term.

If there is no elected Nominations Committee, the members of the Leadership Team shall act as the Nominations Committee.

C. When an elected member is unable to fulfill the duties of her office, the President, with the Chairperson of the committee on Nominations, shall contact her to determine the reasons. If the problem is not resolved, it will be brought to the Executive Committee. If the agreed solution is not met within the time frame given, the Executive Committee will review and recommend to the Leadership Team that the member be removed from the team.

If a member finds it necessary to resign, a letter/email is to be sent to the President with a copy to the Chairperson of the Committee on Nominations.

## STANDING RULES (UPDATE FOR 2021) (CONT. FROM P. 7)

### III. **Leadership Team**

A. **Leadership Team:** Membership of this committee shall include the President, as chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairperson of the Committee on Nominations, additional members of the Leadership Team, and the District Superintendent.

The Leadership Team shall meet as needed to fulfill the work of the district, at least four times a year.

The Secretary shall assist the President in matters of parliamentary procedure.

Other information as to the responsibilities and operation of the Leadership Team may be found in the supporting document, "The Leadership Team: Responsibilities and Operation."

B. **Executive Committee:** Membership of this committee shall include the President, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairperson of the Committee on Nominations.

#### C. **Other Committees:**

- Committees on Nominations and Finance in accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws.
- All members may be part of committees focused on Program Planning, Social Justice, Education, Spiritual Growth, Reading Program, Communications, and Membership, Nurture and Outreach, or others as needed.
- Committee on Standing Rules consisting of the Executive Committee.
- Members of these committees shall meet at least semiannually, and on call of the chairperson

IV. A copy of the District Standing Rules shall be provided to the Conference United Methodist Women Secretary.

V. The district shall conform to the Conference United Methodist Women Policy for Use of A&MD Funds sections I – XIV as they apply to districts.

A. **El Camino Real District** United Methodist Women will follow the Conference United Methodist Women Policy for travel mileage reimbursement.

B. Invited guests and participants, traveling from outside **El Camino Real District**, will be paid travel mileage reimbursement.

VI. These standing rules of the **El Camino Real District** United Methodist Women may be amended by a majority vote of those attending the Annual Meeting of the **El Camino Real District**, provided that the proposed amendments have been presented in writing to the Leadership Team and then recommended by the Leadership Team to the District organization of United Methodist Women at least 30 days before the **El Camino Real District** UMW Annual Meeting.
